The conference will take place at Goethe University Frankfurt on July 9 – 10, 2026 and is supported by the DFG Infrastructure Priority Program “New Data Spaces for the Social Sciences” (SPP 2431), the Research Unit “Interdisciplinary Public Policy” (IPP) at the University of Mainz as well as the Leibniz Institute for Financial Research SAFE.

This is the fourth event of a bi-annual series of conferences that bring together leading international researchers using various empirical methods and data sets (from the lab and the field) to measure key economic variables, such as, e.g., preferences and beliefs.
